

**DISTRICT COUNCIL OF LOWER EYRE PENINSULA**

**ADDITIONAL LOCAL PERMIT CONDITIONS 2017/18**

1. The fire shall not be lit unless the permit (or a copy) is in the actual possession of the person responsible for the fire.
2. The person who is to light the fire has read and fully understands and agrees to comply with the conditions on the rear of the Permit and these 'Local' and 'Prescribed' conditions prior to lighting the fire.
3. No fires shall be lit before **12 midday**
4. All fires must be extinguished by **12 midnight** on the day of lighting the fire
5. Burning off is prohibited on Weekends, Public Holidays, Total Fire Ban Days or when the Grass Fire Danger Index (GFDI) **exceeds a rating of 25** *If you do not have access to this information you will need to contact Councils Fire Prevention Officer 0428 762 375 or CFS Region 6 Port Lincoln 8682 4266.*
6. In addition to 5 above, **prior to lighting the fire** the Permit holder must ensure that all prevailing weather conditions are suitable and due regard has been given to weather forecasts and fire ban warnings on the day of the burn and for the **following 24 hour period.**
7. Prior to lighting the fire the permit holder **must** log the burn with **Adelaide Fire 82043782**. It will be recorded as a controlled burn and appear on the CFS incident list on their website.

You **must** also contact **Councils Fire Prevention Officer 0428 762 375** prior to 10.00am of the day the burn is to be undertaken.

***PLEASE BE ADVISED –***

The holder of the Permit has the overall responsibility to ensure that all conditions are met and that all reasonable care is taken to prevent the escape of fire.

*Section 81 FES Act* – The fact that the holder of a permit has complied with the conditions of the permit does not itself relieve the holder from liability for loss or damage caused by a fire lit under the authority of a Permit.

**CONDITIONS PRESCRIBED by the FES REGULATIONS 2005**  
**(The Conditions on the reverse of the permit)**

Persons who have been issued with a permit under *Section 81 of the FES Act* and who breach the **Prescribed and / or Local Conditions** may be prosecuted and / or issued with an expiation notice.
